## FEATURE ANIMAL: THE BLACK GUILLEMOT

This month, our featured animal is the Black Guillemot. These seabirds live in coastal areas surrounding Newfoundland and Labrador. Though typically staying close to shore in shallow water areas, they can sometimes be found far from shore on pack ice.

Black Guillemots are amazing divers and can stay underwater for up to 2 minutes and 20 seconds. Despite their names, the Black Guillemot is only black in the summer months and is white in the winter.
