



Nunatsiavut Government and Government of Canada Make Progress on Labrador Inuit Protected Area

The Nunatsiavut Government and Parks Canada announced the successful completion of a feasibility assessment for establishing an Inuit Protected Area adjacent to Torngat Mountains National Park, as a part of [Imappivut](#), that deemed the establishment of a new Inuit Protected Area in northern Labrador as **both feasible and desired**. Congratulations to the [Nunatsiavut Government](#) and [Parks Canada](#) for their significant work in completing this crucial step towards protection! By completing this assessment, they have laid the groundwork for creating a protected area that ensures the sustainable management of marine and coastal areas in accordance with Inuit knowledge and culture.
